Forest School is Back!

P2-7 Forest School sessions will usually be held weekly on Monday and Wednesday afternoons between 1.15-2pm for P1-4 and P5-7 respectively.

To ensure that all pupils can take part in Forest School they must have appropriate kit to keep them warm and safe outdoors. Waterproofs are provided but every child will need a change of clothes and wellies. To avoid any disappointment, we would be really grateful if you could send kits in before our first session next week.

Pick up Times

P1 Parents please note: your child will be available to collect at the blue gate at 12 o'clock each day until Friday 29th September.

From Monday 2nd October P1 pupils will stay in school to 2pm unless they are attending 'After School Club' which runs until 3pm.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club will continue to run again this year from 8.15am—8.45am. Children will be fully supervised by qualified staff and provided with a healthy breakfast.

We are very pleased to be able to maintain the cost of £1.00 per child, per day. Siblings will now also cost £1.00. We hope this will help us to improve the facilities on offer.

In order to plan staffing needs and catering requirements in advance we are sending out a form which enables you to notify us of the days your child will attend Breakfast Club. There will no longer be a drop in service except in exceptional circumstances.

After School Clubs

Mrs Todd's After School Club runs Monday to Thursday from 2-3pm. This facility is for any children who are finishing school at 2pm but who choose to stay in school for a 3pm pick up.

Primary 2 finish at 2pm Monday to Thursday.

Primary 3 finish at 2pm Wednesday & Thursday.

The cost of After School Club is £2 per child, per day and this should be sent in with dinner sheets on Monday. It is important we know how many children will be attending After School Club in advance to help us maintain the correct adult to child ratios.

Play SportNI (Starting Tuesday 26th September)

Play SportNI will be returning this year to provide fun, sporty activities after school. It is hoped that they will be able to provide two sessions, P1-3 between 2-3pm and P4-7 between 3pm-4pm. More information about this will be sent out next week.
